## We all... Love Shifnal – the year in pictures!

2024 has been a bumper year for Shifnal and in this edition we look back at some of the wonderful events and promotions that have taken place in the town – organised by Shifnal Town Council, Love Shifnal and Shropshire Festivals as well as the Carnival committee and we look forward to another fantastic year in 2025.



We started the year with a special Valentine's promotion – designed to give customers the opportunity to give a great shout out to the Shifnal businesses they love which was followed by a Frenchthemed Easter Bunny Trail around town organised in partnership with the town's Twinning Association.

The events calendar kicked off with the first Shifnal 10k which was a sell-out event with 350 entries enjoying the scenic route and starting and finishing in the centre of town. The event will be repeated on Sunday 11 May 2025.





The first May Day Bank Holiday saw the centre of Shifnal packed with stalls, entertainment on a stage, games for children and of course, a Maypole. So many people came along to enjoy the day and it was great to see so many youngsters getting involved.





In June a number of Shifnal residents generously opened their gardens to the public for the first ever Shifnal Open Gardens raising funds for local Shropshire charity Community Resource; there was another highly successful Shifnal Carnival and the first ever Heritage Cycle & Motorcycle day – all events which are due to be repeated in 2025.





In August, and throughout the summer holidays, saw Shifnal's history come to life in the Shifnal Discovery Trail, an interactive trail which saw actors highlighting some of Shifnal's high and low-lights

with over 600 people participating.



In September, Shifnal's pubs got together with organisers Shropshire Festivals to hold the town-wide Shifnal Ale Trail, attracting visitors, including the High Sheriff of Shropshire Brian Welti, and appreciative locals alike.
